3. CHARTER

The purpose of the Committee is defined by section 67 of the Bush Fires Act which prescribes that the Committee is to advise Council regarding all matters relating to the preventing, controlling and extinguishing of bush fires, the planning of the layout of firebreaks in the district, prosecutions for breaches of the Bush Fires Act, the formation of bush fire brigades, the ensuring of cooperation and co-ordination of bush fire brigades in their efforts and activities and any other matter relating to bush fire control.

4. ANNOUNCEMENTS BY THE CHIEF BUSH FIRE CONTROL OFFICER & DEPUTY CHIEF BUSH FIRE CONTROL OFFICER

4.1. CHIEF FIRE CONTROL OFFICER

Noted that the unrestricted fire season by two weeks.

Expressed concerns regarding fire pits on the market that may be used at camp sites.

4.2. DEPUTY CHIEF FIRE CONTROL OFFICER

Concerned regarding the state of wooden bridges in the Shire. EMTS advised that the Shire is hopeful in securing funding to undertaking appropriate clearing.

6. GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1. DISCUSSION REGARDING MAJOR PURCHASES FOR 2021/22

- Upgrade to Wandering Fire Station
 - a. EMTS advised that funding for upgrade to the fire station was successful. Works to commence as soon as possible.
- Placement of Emergency Water Tanks (Fire Use only)
 - a. EMTS advised that funding for emergency water tanks at four locations was successful. Discussion on suitable locations.

6.2. UPDATE ON ANNUAL GRANT AND EQUIPMENT

- Brigade Priorities
 - a. Noted that any equipment that is needed must be advised to the Shire before February 2022 to enable it to be included in the grant submission.
- Satellite Phones Sleeves
 - a. Appear to be working well.
 - b. Tim Treasure queried if a phone booster could be purchased for the Fire Truck. (Cell Fire)
- Replacement Fridge/Freezer
- Fire Station Stand Pipe Pump
- PPE Equipment replacement and purchase
 - a. Noted that equipment available after the meeting.
- Purchases since April 2021
 - a. Satellite mobile phone sleeves
 - b. Upgraded water tanks for Fire Station

 - d. Repaired Fire Station lighting
 - e. Serviced fire trucks pumps

6.3. UPDATE ON ANNUAL GRANT AND EQUIPMENT

6.4. FAST ATTACK UNIT

- High Season

 - a. Regular meetings being attended by CBFCO. Fast Attack coming on loan from Cuballing.

6.5. UPDATE ON WAERN RADIOS

- Proposed fortnightly call to Shire bases station so to confirm radios are working;
 a. Agreed to trial
- Shire requesting notifications of any required servicing prior to 30 October 2021
 - a. Noted none known at this stage.

6.6. FIRE BREAK INSPECTIONS

• WA Ranger Services has completed property inspections for the town area and rural residential properties on the 22 September. Letters have been sent to land owners advising them that their property currently doesn't comply with the Shire of Wandering Bushfire Notice 2021/22. The next inspection will be on or after the 30 October for compliance, an infringement notice will be issued and given 14 days to comply or the Shire will arrange for the work to be completed and invoice the land owner.

• If any FCO's have any rural properties of concern please advise the Shire so the Ranger can inspect.

6.7. WORK HEALTH AND SAFETY ACT 2020

- Discussion on Bushfire Volunteers and actions required
 - a. Noted that a lot of discussion in this area. It is serious for volunteers who will be classified as "employees" under the new Act. Extensive discussion on the matter.

• Bush Fire Notice for 2020/21 was sent out with the Rate Notice

6.9. GENERAL BUSINESS

- Season Outlook
 - a. CBFCO concerned with amount of grass following the wet winter. Summer fuel loads will be higher than average. Diminishing number of volunteers is also a concern.
- Servicing of vehicles and plant

- CBFCO thank you to the Shire for the SMS updates. Thank you to the volunteers as well.
- Cr Turton noted that the EMTS and he attend the LEMC (Local Emergency Management Committee)
- CBFCO noted that volunteer BFB's cannot fight structural fires.

- Tim Treasure ROAC meeting Boddington have fitted out an old ambulance as a mobile command centre. Concerns regarding the old Mission property and the lack of management of the bush land.

- DFES talk that Boddington are looking to apply for a CESM (Community Emergency Services Manager).
- DPAW to send through burning program.
