CEO's Update

Well what a month February turned out to be....

The rain that we have experienced caused a reasonable amount of damage through out the Shire, there have been different impacts for different residents and the Shire has been working to better understand these.

Rod and I have just completed our final assessments and will submit them to Main Roads WA for assessment and approval over the next week or so. The Shire has 22 roads that should qualify for funding. Its quite a long process to document the damage appropriately, correlate it with supporting evidence and photos etc... Most local councils have engaged a contractor to do this, however Wandering isn't in a position to do so, we ask that people bear with us. Once the claim is submitted Main Roads will send out assessors to verify the damage and fingers crossed

approve it. It is important that we don't alter the state of the roads too much prior to assessment if possible. Ken has been out in the grader trying to give trouble spots a quick grade to improve safety where possible.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank those residents that helped out during the few days and after, we very much appreciate those who have cleaned drains, culverts and road ways.

I would also like to thank Cathy Cornish who has been out and about with her new metal detector... Cathy has been out and checked on our playgrounds and other public places keeping an eye out for needles and other dangerous objects. Many thanks Cathy for your time and care.

Congratulations to Leisa Turton and helpers on the 2017 Annual Fox Hunt. The Shire is proud to help out with the event and pleased to see so many take the time and effort to support the feral animal control initiative. Congratulations to Grant White and Team on taking out top spot again.

Dog Registrations and Micro Chipping

The Council would like to take this opportunity to remind residents of the Shire that registering and chipping your dog is vital to us when your dog is lost or escapes... Recently some residents have incurred significant fines as a result of their dog being impounded. Please note we do not want to or like to have to fine or impound and would very much like to be able give you a quick ring to come and collect your dog! So lets work together and protect our local dogs and save you being fined by getting all animals in the Shire registered and chipped ASAP!! Call Helen at the Office who will help you with this.



With the recent rain—there is likely to be an increase in mozzies in and around Wandering... Please consider the following in an effort to keep yourselves and the community mozzie bite free.

COVER UP Wear long, loose-fitting, light coloured clothing, covering as much of the body as you can. Mosquitoes can bite through tight clothes like jeans. Make sure children are also appropriately covered up.

REPEL

Use <u>insect repellent</u> containing DEET (diethyltoluamide) or picaridin and always follow instructions on the label.

CLEAN UP

Stop mosquitoes breeding in water pooling around your home or holiday accommodation by emptying water from containers and draining areas where water ponds, such as low lying areas or gutters that don't fully drain.
