5. Closure of Meeting

REPORT to UPGRADE COMMITTEE 7 April 2025

Since the last Project Manager report, the following items have taken place and are presented to the Community Centre Upgrade Committee Meeting on 9 April for consideration and acceptance:

Community Centre Kitchen Upgrade:

The rangehood canopy over the ovens has been installed and the plasterboard ceiling is now in place in the kitchen. This will probably be followed by the storeroom ceiling which will be of tile design to provide for future access to the ceiling void. The solartube skylights appear to light up the kitchen area well.

The old servery roller shutters have been removed fron the kitchen/hall wall, and the opening has been cut through the brick wall into the hall from the bar area for the third internal roller shutter.

The old grease trap has been removed, and the new grease trap installed in the grass area between the Community Centre and the tennis court. The replacement grease trap was the subject of a contract variation to the value of \$11,760.00.

The relaying of the paving around the carpark end of the store room has been done, with paving to continue in the southern veranda area now that the grease trap has been installed..

The contract completion date remains at 30 April 2025.



Community Centre Internal Amenities Upgrade:
