DECLARATION OF INTERESTS (NOTES FOR YOUR GUIDANCE) (updated 13 March 2000)

A member who has a Financial Interest in any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee Meeting, which will be attended by the member, must disclose the nature of the interest:

- (a) In a written notice given to the Chief Executive Officer before the Meeting or;
- (b) At the Meeting, immediately before the matter is discussed.

A member, who makes a disclosure in respect to an interest, must not:

- (c) Preside at the part of the Meeting, relating to the matter or;
- (d) Participate in, or be present during any discussion or decision-making procedure relative to the matter, unless to the extent that the disclosing member is allowed to do so under Section 5.68 or Section 5.69 of the Local Government Act 1995.

NOTES ON FINANCIAL INTEREST (FOR YOUR GUIDANCE)

The following notes are a basic guide for Councillors when they are considering whether they have a Financial Interest in a matter. I intend to include these notes in each agenda for the time being so that Councillors may refresh their memory.

- A Financial Interest requiring disclosure occurs when a Council decision might
 advantageously or detrimentally affect the Councillor or a person closely associated with the
 Councillor and is capable of being measured in money terms. There are exceptions in the
 Local Government Act 1995 but they should not be relied on without advice, unless the
 situation is very clear.
- 2. If a Councillor is a member of an Association (which is a Body Corporate) with not less than 10 members i.e. sporting, social, religious etc), and the Councillor is not a holder of office of profit or a guarantor, and has not leased land to or from the club, i.e., if the Councillor is an ordinary member of the Association, the Councillor has a common and not a financial interest in any matter to that Association.
- 3. If an interest is shared in common with a significant number of electors or ratepayers, then the obligation to disclose that interest does not arise. Each case needs to be considered.
- 4. If in doubt declare.
- 5. As stated in (b) above, if written notice disclosing the interest has not been given to the Chief Executive Officer before the meeting, then it MUST be given when the matter arises in the Agenda, and immediately before the matter is discussed.
- 6. Ordinarily the disclosing Councillor must leave the meeting room before discussion commences. The only exceptions are:
 - **6.1** Where the Councillor discloses the extent of the interest, and Council carries a motion under s.5.68(1)(b)(ii) or the Local Government Act; or
 - **6.2** Where the Minister allows the Councillor to participate under s5.69 (3) of the Local Government Act, with or without conditions.

INTERESTS AFFECTING IMPARTIALITY

DEFINITION: An interest that would give rise to a reasonable belief that the impartiality of the person having the interest would be adversely affected, but does not include an interest as referred to in Section 5.60 of the 'Act'.

A member who has an Interest Affecting Impartiality in any matter to be discussed at a Council or Committee Meeting, which will be attended by the member, must disclose the nature of the interest;

- (a) in a written notice given to the Chief Executive Officer before the Meeting; or
- (b) at the Meeting, immediately before the matter is discussed.

IMPACT OF AN IMPARTIALITY CLOSURE

There are very different outcomes resulting from disclosing an interest affecting impartiality compared to that of a financial interest. With the declaration of a financial interest, an elected member leaves the room and does not vote.

With the declaration of this new type of interest, the elected member stays in the room, participates in the debate and votes. In effect then, following disclosure of an interest affecting impartiality, the member's involvement in the Meeting continues as if no interest existed.

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

The Shire Administration has been working with the Wandering Lions to facilitate the sale of the Shire's surplus equipment, minor plant and stock. The Auction is set to go ahead on the 18 February 2017. The Lions will undertake all aspects of the sale and the logistical management. 10% of all sales will go the Lions for their charitable purposes. Council is asked to approve the listing for sale of the Council's assets as presented.

BACKGROUND

The Wandering Lions Club has offered on a number of occasions over the last few years to undertake an auction to support the Shire in selling of their surplus items. The Lions are keen to undertake all logistical matters on the day and facilitate the sale of the items.

Council has significant surplus equipment, plant and stock that has not been used and is taking up valuable space at the Shire Depot. Extensive evaluation has taken place over the last 12 months to identify the strategic use of the equipment and plant to ensure that the listed items are definitely surplus to Council's needs and operational requirements.

COMMENT/ DETAILS

The Shire Administration and Works Team have been working over the last few months to identify all surplus stock and plant. There are many items listed for Council to endorse their sale. In most instances they are surplus to our needs and whilst they have been saved/kept just in case, the Shire has not been in a position to use them in recent times. There are extensive bathroom fixtures and fittings and household items that if not used will go out of date and whilst possibly not worth anything near their original value they will only lose more value over time.

ATTACHMENT 10.1.2.1

The Items Listed are not currently listed on Councils asset register and do not contribute to the current financial position of the Shire.

The Shire Administration has been negotiating with the Wandering Lions Club to facilitate the Monster Auction and has offered the Shires Depot and Cheetaning Oval as venues for the Auction, The Council will also support with advertising to ensure all statutory requirements are met.

Council will need to have Staff and equipment available on the day to support the logistics, but all other matters will be covered by the Lions. Council will be required to meet the Lions commercial terms to undertake the sale, which stipulates that 10% of all sales are retained by the Lions Club.

It is recommended that Council endorse the sale of the items listed in Attachment 10.1.2.1 by the Wandering Lions Club Monster Auction.

STATUTORY/ LEGAL ENVIRONMENT

Local Government Act 1995

Section 3.58. Disposing of property

(1) In this section —

dispose includes to sell, lease, or otherwise dispose of, whether absolutely or not; **property** includes the whole or any part of the interest of a local government in property, but does not include money.

- (2) Except as stated in this section, a local government can only dispose of property to
 - (a) the highest bidder at public auction; or
 - (b) the person who at public tender called by the local government makes what is, in the opinion of the local government, the most acceptable tender, whether or not it is the highest tender.
- (3) A local government can dispose of property other than under subsection (2) if, before agreeing to dispose of the property
 - (a) it gives local public notice of the proposed disposition
 - (i) describing the property concerned; and
 - (ii) giving details of the proposed disposition; and
 - (iii) inviting submissions to be made to the local government before a date to be specified in the notice, being a date not less than 2 weeks after the notice is first given;

and

- (b) it considers any submissions made to it before the date specified in the notice and, if its decision is made by the council or a committee, the decision and the reasons for it are recorded in the minutes of the meeting at which the decision was made.
- (4) The details of a proposed disposition that are required by subsection (3)(a)(ii) include
 - (a) the names of all other parties concerned; and
 - (b) the consideration to be received by the local government for the disposition; and
 - (c) the market value of the disposition
 - (i) as ascertained by a valuation carried out not more than 6 months before the proposed disposition; or
 - (ii) as declared by a resolution of the local government on the basis of a valuation carried out more than 6 months before the proposed disposition that the local government believes to be a true indication of the value at the time of the proposed disposition.

- (5)This section does not apply to
 - a disposition of an interest in land under the Land Administration Act 1997 section 189 or 190; or
 - a disposition of property in the course of carrying on a trading undertaking as defined in (b) section 3.59; or
 - anything that the local government provides to a particular person, for a fee or otherwise, in the performance of a function that it has under any written law; or
 - (d) any other disposition that is excluded by regulations from the application of this section.

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

To provide Council with a breakdown of the Roads to Recovery Funding received by Council and how it has been allocated in the 2016/17 annual budget so Council can further consider the Motion put forward by Mr K Price at the 2 November 2016 Annual Electors Meeting.

BACKGROUND

Mr K Price (ratepayer and past Shire President) put forward the following motion at the Annual Electors Meeting on the 2 November 2016:

That the Wandering Shire Council take enough money from the Roads to Recovery Program to cover the cost of summer grading, to keep the roads in good condition through the 2016 – 17 summer and thereafter in the years to come. The item was moved by Mr K Price and Seconded by Mrs J Cornish and carried 6/3.

Mr K Price stated that the lack of a formalised summer grading program last year, was not acceptable and he asked the Wandering Shire Council to consider his motion seriously going forward. At the 17 November 2016 Ordinary Meeting of Council in Item 10.1.2 Council recommended that the CEO report to Council at the 15 December 2016 Meeting, providing a thorough breakdown of the Roads to Recovery Program and the annual maintenance grading program.

COMMENT/ DETAILS

The current program that was budgeted for by the direction of Council is as follows:

Specific Roads to Recovery Projects - Tied to specific improvements works and projects, roads, SLK's and work to be undertaken has to be signed off by Office of Roads to Recovery in Canberra.

Ferguson Place Road Works	\$153,483.00
Carbine East Road, Part 1	\$113,324.00
Cheetaning Street Reseal	\$ 10,922.00
Down Street Culvert	\$ 60,271.00
	\$338,000.00

No Shortfall, Council has budgeted to expend the funds that were available.

Roads to Recovery Direct Grant – Funds are received through the Grants Commission for local roads.

Council received \$213,892.00 this year and has contributed the remaining \$144,786 to make up the rural road maintenance budget of \$358,678.00.

This is an increase on last year of \$48,678.00, as it was recognised that Council had cut the budget too hard last financial year and this did limit the opportunity to undertake the necessary adhoc grading as required.

The budget this year provides for the 2016 winter grade, reinstatement post the 2016 harvest, summer grading as required and the commencement of the 2017 winter grade should the rain turn up in time. The Works crew are committed to trying to get medium outcomes for many in a very challenged financial environment.

All specific project works have commenced to some degree and funds have been claimed for the specific jobs. Discussions with the Roads to Recovery Office in Canberra have indicated that it is very complex to unravel at this stage and that it is highly unlikely that grading would be authorised in the Specific Project Funding Category. Council would be significantly compromised financially should any major adjustments be made to the budget at this late stage in the financial year.

The Shire Administration suggests that Council maintain the budget as is for this financial year and perhaps review the status of the roads at quarterly intervals for the remainder of the financial year with a view to consider the motion further during the formulation of the 2017/18 annual budget.

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

This report recommends that a planning application submitted by Ian and Katherine Price to begin operation of a plant nursery at Lot 1 Pollard Road, Wandering be approved, subject to appropriate conditions.

BACKGROUND

The applicant is seeking Council's planning approval to operate a plant nursery at Lot 1 Pollard Road, Wandering. The applicant currently operates a mobile plant nursery service where plants are sold at designated fairs and market days. They are seeking approval to allow customers to access their services outside of these activities.

Based on the definitions of the Shire of Wandering's Town Planning Scheme No.3 (TPS No.3) this application is considered to be a plant nursery use. There is currently a residence on the site that will not be affected by the proposed nursery.

The subject site is located to the north of the Wandering town site, with access made via Mellows Road and Charlton Road from the North Bannister Wandering Road. The lot abuts Lot 2 to the east, which has a residence currently on site. The remainder of the street appears to be residential in nature, while the adjoining land to the north and west appears to be used for agricultural purposes.

Under the terms of the information and plans submitted in support of the application the following is proposed:

- 1. The business is to be a small scale plant nursery. The majority of stock is purchased through accredited wholesalers, and minimal propagation will be undertaken on site.
- 2. Proposed nursery will be on existing level ground and located by an already constructed shed and water tank. Total area to be utilised will be approximately 50m2. (Refer Attachment 10.2.1.2).
- 3. The use is proposed to operate between 9am and 5pm, seven days a week, including public holidays. Clients will attend the site by appointment only, and it is expected that only two (2) cars a day will attend the site.
- 4. The site is already being used to store the plants for sale off the property. The applicant is seeking the approval to allow people to visit the site rather than wait for a fair or market day.
- 5. The applicant collects plants for the nursery; no deliveries will be made to the property.

COMMENT/ DETAILS

Zoning and Proposed Land Use Permissibility

The subject site is zoned as 'Rural Residential' under the Shire of Wandering's current operative TPS No.3.

The objectives outlined for rural residential zoned land within the Shire are as follows:

- a) "To select areas wherein closer subdivision will be permitted to provide for such uses as hobby farms, horse breeding, rural-residential retreats, and rural-based commercial uses that are consistent with a rural residential zone.
- b) To generally select areas that are within approximately 8 kilometres of the town of Wandering to facilitate the provision of services to residents.
- c) To make provision for retention of the rural landscape and amenity in a manner consistent with the orderly and proper planning of such areas.
- d) Having regard for the size of the district, the fragile nature of the environment in many places, and the difficulties faced by the local government in providing services away from the town of Wandering, the local government will generally favour Rural-Residential zones be located close to the town of Wandering and then only where the environmental impacts are manageable".

Under TPS No.3 plant nursery is defined as follows:

"Means premises used for the propagation, rearing, and sale of plants and the storage and sale of products associated with the horticultural and garden activities."

Under the terms of TPS No.3 the plant nursery land use is a 'D' class use within a Rural Residential zone. This means that the use is not permitted unless Council exercises its discretion by granting approval.

Compliance with Development Standards

After completing an assessment of the proposal against the development standards prescribed in TPS No.3, it is considered that the proposal satisfies the setback requirements prescribed by the Shires TPS No. 3.

It is considered that the proposal is unlikely to have any adverse impacts for the following reasons:

- a) No formal structures will be erected on site;
- b) While there is potential for a minor increase in the amount of traffic on Pollard Road it is considered that the increase will not be detrimental to the rural landscape and amenity of the area; and
- c) While the application is for a proposed nursery it is considered that the minimal level of propagation to be undertaken on site will not have a high level of impact upon the natural soil of the area.

It is concluded following a detailed assessment of the application that the proposal for a plant nursery at Lot 1 Pollard Road, Wandering be approved as the scale of the proposal is deemed to be minor and will not have an undue impact on the general amenity, character, functionality and safety of the immediate locality.

CONSULTATION

The proposal was advertised to surrounding landowners for a period of 14 days. During this time a total of two (2) responses were received, comprising one (1) non objection, and one (1) objection with comments. Within the objection the following concerns were raised:

- 1. The proposal is in not compatible with the Rural Residential Zoning.
- 2. The hours of operation are excessive.
- 3. Operation of the nursery will cause a high level of noise pollution.
- 4. The business will have to truck in water, which will cause noise pollution.
- 5. Ongoing disposal of waste from the building will create a negative visual impact.
- 6. Deliveries on site will disrupt the area.
- 7. Use of chemicals and pesticides on site may cause water table pollution and runoff issues.

In response to these objections the following is considered:

Incompatible Land Use

As stated earlier the proposal is classified as a 'D' class use under TPS No.3. This means that the use can be supported by Council and is not incompatible to the zoning.

Excessive Hours of Operation

While the nursery is proposed to operate 9am to 5pm, seven (7) days a week, the applicant expects that a maximum of two (2) cars will attend the site per day by appointment only. This will increase the number of cars per week to a maximum of 14. It is considered that this is not an excessive increase in car traffic for the area.

Noise Pollution

No industrial machines will be used on site and the scale of the development is considered to be small enough to not create any increase in noise.

Trucking in Water

It is possible that water may need to be trucked in, depending on the amount of rainfall received. However, this is common practice for residents in most rural areas, where rainwater is the only water source.

Waste Disposal

Because of the scale of the business there is minimal waste disposal required. Any green waste is to be disposed of at an appropriate waste disposal/transfer facility.

Deliveries Onsite

No deliveries of business supplies, chemicals or fertilisers are required.

Use of Chemicals and Pesticides Onsite

The applicant submits that pesticides and chemicals are not required for maintaining stock. Organic processes and practices are preferred and implemented.

PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

This report suggests that Council recommends approval to the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) regarding a subdivision and amalgamation application submitted by Mr Peter Gow on behalf of Mr Graeme Kerr for lots 17294, 18847 and 7978 Corser Road, Hastings.

BACKGROUND

The applicant is seeking approval from the WAPC to amalgamate lots 17294, 18847 and 7978 into one large lot, before subdividing the new lot into two separate lots (Refer Attachments 2, 3, and 4). The WAPC is generally required to determine the application within 90 days of receiving the application, and refers the application to various organisations for their comments and recommendations. The Shire of Wandering is one such organisation.

Council does not have the authority to refuse or approve the application. However, the recommendations made by the various organisations are given due regard when the WAPC make their final determination.

The applicant is proposing to create two lots of 477.69 hectares and 471.45 hectares from the three initial lots mentioned above.

COMMENT/ DETAILS

Zoning and Proposed Land Use Permissibility

The subject site is zoned as 'Rural' under the Shire of Wandering's current operative Town Planning Scheme No.3 (TPS No.3).

The objectives outlined for rural residential zoned land within the Shire are as follows:

- e) "To ensure the continuation of broad-hectare agriculture in the district encouraging where appropriate the retention and expansion of agricultural activities.
- To provide for diversification and intensive agricultural uses in sustainable areas.
- g) To consider non-rural uses where they can be shown to be of benefit to the district and not detrimental to the natural resources or the environment.
- h) To allow for facilities for tourists and travellers, and for recreation uses.
- i) To have regard to use of adjoining land at the interface of the Rural zone with other zones to avoid adverse effects on local amenities."

Compliance with Subdivision Standards

After completing an assessment of the proposal against the subdivision standards prescribed in TPS No.3 Section 5.17.4 (Subdivision of Rural Land), it is considered that the proposal satisfies the requirements prescribed by the Shires TPS No. 3 as follows:

Potential impact upon continuation of existing uses on adjoining lots:

Following assessment of aerial imagery (Attachment 10.2.2.1) it has been determined that the subject site and the surrounding lots are in use for agricultural purposes. It is considered that the amalgamation of the existing lots will not impact upon the current land use, or the surrounding land uses.

Evidence of a sustainable water supply that does not rely on catchment outside the proposed lot or lots, or the damming of a stream that will impact upon other lots:

Aerial imagery suggests the presence of a number of dams already situated on the proposed lots. There is no evidence to suggest that any streams have been affected previously to the detriment of surrounding land owners. While it is considered that the proposal will not cause any undue impact on the availability of water within the area, a condition has been placed on the recommendation to the WAPC (Attachment 5) outlining this.

Effluent disposal systems being set back 100m (conventional system) or 50m (alternative system) from any stream:

Assessment has determined that there do not appear to be any existing effluent disposal systems on site. It is further considered that such a condition can be adequately addressed at a future development stage, if any effluent system is proposed as part of an application.

Further to the above it is considered that the amalgamation of the lots will not increase the number of lots within the area, and the size of the lots will satisfy the requirements of broad-hectare agriculture within the area. Both lots will have access available to them (Ulbrich and Corser Road) and appear to be currently used for agricultural purposes with no indication that this will change in the future. Such subdivision is in line with both the TPS No 3 and *Development Control Policy 3.4 – Subdivision of Rural Land.*

- A Financial Interest requiring disclosure occurs when a Council decision might
 advantageously or detrimentally affect the Councillor or a person closely associated with the
 Councillor and is capable of being measured in money terms. There are exceptions in the
 Local Government Act 1995 but they should not be relied on without advice, unless the
 situation is very clear.
- 2. If a Councillor is a member of an Association (which is a Body Corporate) with not less than 10 members i.e. sporting, social, religious etc), and the Councillor is not a holder of office of profit or a guarantor, and has not leased land to or from the club, i.e., if the Councillor is an ordinary member of the Association, the Councillor has a common and not a financial interest in any matter to that Association.
- 3. If an interest is shared in common with a significant number of electors or ratepayers, then the obligation to disclose that interest does not arise. Each case needs to be considered.
- 4. If in doubt declare.
- 5. As stated in (b) above, if written notice disclosing the interest has not been given to the Chief Executive Officer before the meeting, then it MUST be given when the matter arises in the Agenda, and immediately before the matter is discussed.
- 6. Ordinarily the disclosing Councillor must leave the meeting room before discussion commences. The only exceptions are:
 - **6.1** Where the Councillor discloses the extent of the interest, and Council carries a motion under s.5.68(1)(b)(ii) or the Local Government Act; or
 - **6.2** Where the Minister allows the Councillor to participate under s5.69 (3) of the Local Government Act, with or without conditions.

We propose that the business will operate by appointment only, and we estimate traffic flow to be approximately 2 cars per day on average.







1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The significant accounting policies which have been adopted in the preparation of this statement of financial activity are:

(a) Basis of Accounting

This statement is a special purpose financial report, prepared in accordance with applicable Australian Australian Accounting Standards, other mandatory professional reporting requirements and the Local Government Act 1995 (as amended) and accompanying regulations (as amended).

All Funds through which the Council controls resources to carry on its functions have been included in this statement.

In the process of reporting on the local government as a single unit, all transactions and balances between those funds (for example, loans and transfers between Funds) have been eliminated.

All monies held in the Trust Fund are excluded from the statement, but a separate statement of those monies appears at Note 11.

(c) Rounding Off Figures

All figures shown in this statement are rounded to the nearest dollar.

(d) Rates, Grants, Donations and Other Contributions

Rates, grants, donations and other contributions are recognised as revenues when the local government obtains control over the assets comprising the contributions. Control over assets acquired from rates is obtained at the commencement of the rating period or, where earlier, upon receipt of the rates.

(e) Goods and Services Tax

In accordance with recommended practice, revenues, expenses and assets capitalised are stated net of any GST recoverable. Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of applicable GST.

(f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand and short-term deposits that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

For the purposes of the Cash Flow Statement, cash and cash equivalents consist of cash and cash equivalents as defined above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are included as short-term borrowings in current liabilities.

(g) Trade and Other Receivables

Trade receivables, which generally have 30 - 90 day terms, are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, less any allowance for uncollectible amounts.

Collectability of trade receivables is reviewed on an ongoing basis. Debts that are known to be uncollectible

(h) Inventories

General

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs of necessary to make the sale.

Inventories held from trading are classified as current even if not expected to be reaised in the next 12

months.

Land Held for Resale

Land purchased for development and/or resale is valued at the lower of the cost and net realisable value. Cost includes the cost of acquisition, development and interest incurred on the financing of that land during its development. Interest and holding charges incurred after development is complete are recognised as expenses.

Revenue arising from the sale of property is recognised in the operating statmement as at the time of signing a binding contract of sale.

Land held for resale is classified as current except where it is held as non-current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(i) Fixed Assets

All assets are initially recognised at cost. Cost is determined as the fair value of the assets given as consideration plus costs incidental to the acquisition. For assets acquired at no cost or for nominal consideration, cost is determined as fair value at the date of acquisition. The cost of non-current assets constructed by the locla government includes the cost of all materials used in the construction, direct labour on the project and an appropriate proportion of variable and fixed overhead.

Certain asset classes may be revalued on a regular basis such that the carrying values are not materially different from fair value. Assets carried at fair value are to be revalued with sufficient regularity to ensure the carrying amount does not differ materially from that determined using fair value at reporting date.

(j) Depreciation of Non-Current Assets

All non-current assets having a limited useful life are systematically depreciated over their useful lives in a manner which reflects the consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in those assets.

Depreciation is recognised on a straight-line basis, using rates which are reviewed each reporting period. Major depreciation rates and periods are:

(k) Trade and Other Payables

Drains and Sewers

Trade and other payables are carried at amortised cost. They represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the local government prior to the end of the financial year that are unpaid and arise when the Shire becomes obliged to make future payments in respect of the purchase of these goods and services. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 30 days of recognition.

(1) Employee Benefits

The provisions for employee benefits relates to amounts expected to be paid for long service leave, annual leave, wages and salaries and are calculated as follows:

(i) Wages, Salaries, Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Short-term Benefits) The provision for employees' benefits to wages, salaries, annual leave and long service leave expected to be settled within 12 months represents the amount the Shire has a present obligation to pay resulting from employees services provided to balance date. The provision has been calculated at nominal amounts based on remuneration rates the Shire expects to pay and includes related on-costs.

(ii) Annual Leave and Long Service Leave (Long-term Benefits)

The liability for long service leave is recognised in the provision for employee benefits and measured as the present value of expected future payments to be made in respect of services provided by employees up to the reporting date using the project unit credit method. Consideration is given to expected future wage and salary levels, experience of employee departures and periods of service. Expected future payments are discounted using market yields at the reporting date on national government bonds with terms to maturity and currency that match as closely as possible, the estimated future cash outflows. Where the Shire does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, the liability is recognised as a current liability.

(m) Interest-bearing Loans and Borrowings

All loans and borrowings are initially recognised at the fair value of the consideration received less directly attributable transaction costs.

After initial recognition, interest-bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities that are yield related are included as part of the carrying amount of the loans and borrowings.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the Council has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the balance sheet date.

Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs are recognised as an expense when incurred except where they are directly attributable to the acquisition, construction or production of a qualifying asset. Where this is the case, they are capitalised as part of the cost of the particular asset.

(n) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when: The concil has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events; it is more likely than not that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation; and the amount has been reliably estimated. Provisions are not recognised for future operating losses.

Where there are a number of similar obligations, the likelihood that an outflow will be required in settlement is determined by considering the class of obligations as a whole. A provision is recognised even if the likelihood of an outflow with respect to any one of item included in the same class of obligatios may be small.

(o) Current and Non-Current Classification

In the determination of whether an asset or liability is current or non-current, consideration is given to the time when each asset or liability is expected to be settled. The asset or liability is classified as current if it is expected to be settled within the next 12 months, being the Council's operational cycle. In the case of liabilities where Council does not have the unconditional right to defer settlement beyond 12 months, such as vested long service leave, the liability is classified as current even if not expected to be settled within the next 12 months. Inventories held for trading are classified as current even if not expected to be realised in the next 12 months except for land held for resale where it is held as non current based on Council's intentions to release for sale.

(p) Nature or Type Classifications

Rates

All rates levied under the Local Government Act 1995. Includes general, differential, specific area rates, minimum rates, interim rates, back rates, ex-gratia rates, less discounts offered. Exclude administration fees, interest on instalments, interest on arrears, service charges and sewerage rates.

Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Refer to all amounts received as grants, subsidies and contributions that are not non-operating grants.

Non-Operating Grants, Subsidies and Contributions

Amounts received specifically for the acquisition, construction of new or the upgrading of non-current assets paid to a local government, irrespective of whether these amounts are received as capital grants, subsidies, contributions or donations.

Profit on Asset Disposal

Profit on the disposal of assets including gains on the disposal of long term investments. Losses are disclosed under the expenditure classifications.

Fees and Charges

Revenues (other than service charges) from the use of facilities and charges made for local government services, sewerage rates, rentals, hire charges, fee for service, photocopying charges, licences, sale of goods or information, fines, penalties and administration fees. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as rubbish collection fees, rental of property, fines and penalties, other fees and charges.

Service Charges

Service charges imposed under Division 6 of Part 6 of the Local Government Act 1995. Regulation 54 of the Local Government (Financial Management) Regulations 1996 identifies these as television and radio broadcasting, underground electricity, neighbourhood surveillance services and water. Exclude rubbish removal charges. Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

Interest Earnings

Interest and other items of a similar nature received from bank and investment accounts, interest on rate instalments, interest on rate arrears and interest on debtors.

Other Revenue / Income

Other revenue, which can not be classified under the above headings, includes dividends, discounts, rebates etc.

Employee Costs

All costs associated with the employment of persons such as salaries, wages, allowances, benefits such as vehicle and housing, superannuation, employment expenses, removal expenses, relocation expenses, worker's compensation insurance, training costs, conferences, safety expenses, medical examinations, fringe benefit tax, etc.

Materials and Contracts

All expenditures on materials, supplies and contracts not classified under other headings. These include supply of goods and materials, legal expenses, consultancy, maintenance agreements, communication expenses, advertising expenses, membership, periodicals, publications, hire expenses, rental, leases, postage and freight etc. Local governments may wish to disclose more detail such as contract services, consultancy, information technology, rental or lease expenditures.

Utilities (Gas, Electricity, Water, etc.)

Expenditures made to the respective agencies for the provision of power, gas or water. Exclude expenditures incurred for the reinstatement of roadwork on behalf of these agencies.

(q) Nature or Type Classifications (Continued)

Insurance

All insurance other than worker's compensation and health benefit insurance included as a cost of employment.

Loss on asset disposal

Loss on the disposal of fixed assets.

Depreciation on non-current assets

Depreciation expense raised on all classes of assets.

Interest expenses

Interest and other costs of finance paid, including costs of finance for loan debentures, overdraft accommodation and refinancing expenses.

Other expenditure

Statutory fees, taxes, provision for bad debts, member's fees or levies including WA Fire Brigade Levy and State taxes. Donations and subsidies made to community groups.

(r) Statement of Objectives

In order to discharge its responsibilities to the community, the Council has developed a set of operational and financial objectives. These objectives have been established both on an overall basis and for each of its broad activities/programs.

Council operations as disclosed in this statement encompass the following service orientated activities/programs:

GOVERNANCE

Details of expenses related to Councils eight councillors, who normally meet the third Wednesday of each month, make policy decisions, review Councils operations, plan for current and future service provision requirements and undertake necessary appropriate training and attend conferences.

GENERAL PURPOSE FUNDING

Rates - the amount raised is determined by Councils budget "shortfall" that is known income and desired expenditure.

General purpose grants - are the grant amounts paid to the shire from Federal Government funding as determined by and via the Western Australian Local Government Grants Commission.

Interest - interest earned on monies invested or deposited by Council.

LAW, ORDER, PUBLIC SAFETY

Supervision of by-laws, fire prevention and animal control. Requirements that Council carries out by statute.

HEALTH

Food quality control, immunisation, contributions to medical, health and operation of the child health clinic.

Council is a member of a group health scheme North Eastern Wheatbelt Health Scheme. Monitors food quality and caters for health requirements for the broader community.

(r) STATEMENT OF OBJECTIVE (Continued)

EDUCATION AND WELFARE

Assists in the provision of the Home and Community Care services, Seniors and Pensioner requirements.

HOUSING

Provides and maintains housing rented to staff and non-staff. Council is a major landlord, providing accommodation for aged, pensioner, single, married and Government Employees.

COMMUNITY AMENITIES

Operation and control of cemeteries, public conveniences and sanitation service. Provides public amenities. Owns and operates the town site deep sewerage service. Controls and maintains one rubbish disposal site.

RECREATION AND CULTURE

Maintenance of hall, the aquatic centre, library and various reserves.

TRANSPORT

Construction and maintenance of roads, footpaths, drainage works and cleaning of streets. Provision of infrastructure necessary to ensure adequate transport, communication, freight, social access routes and environmental enhancement within the shire.

ECONOMIC SERVICES


Tourism, pest control, building controls and natural resource management. Tourism facilities, information and directional signs. Weed and pest control services. Necessary building control services.

OTHER PROPERTY & SERVICES


Private works carried out by council and indirect cost allocation pools.






