### COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Council elections are coming around again this year and will be held on 19 October 2013. There are four positions on Council up for re-election and the nomination period is open for 8 days, opening on Thursday 5 September and **closing on Friday 12 September at 4.00pm.**

Further details relating the election process will be provided in the coming months.

### 2013/14 BUDGET

Council met on Tuesday 30 July to discuss the draft budget. The final budget will be submitted with the view to being adopted at the August 2013 Council meeting. Details of the adopted budget will be made available following the August meeting.

### ROADWORKS

Gravel sheeting reinstatement works continue on the York Williams Road and Codjototone Hastings Road. All road projects are being progressed by external contractors funded under the Western Australian Natural Disaster Relief Arrangements (WANDDRA). Due to the timing of the works and the likelihood of inclement weather in the next month please take due care when accessing these roads.

### BOWLING GREEN / TENNIS COURT REFURBISHMENT

Concept plans for the Bowling Green / Tennis Court Refurbishment are currently being completed and will be considered by Council once finalised. After further consideration the concept plans considered appropriate by Council will be made available for public comment.

### CATS

Cat owners are reminded that a new Cat Legislation has now been passed meaning that by 1 November 2013 all cats will need to be sterilised and micro chipped.

### DOGS

We have received numerous reports from residents regarding excessive barking and dogs roaming the streets in Wandering in recent weeks.

Residents in town are reminded that all dogs are required to be registered and that there can only be a maximum of 2 registered dogs over the age of 3 months at any one property. Failure to comply with the above requirements can result in fines of up to \$1,000 per offence and a daily penalty of \$100 day.

Dogs must also be controlled by means of a chain, cord, leash or harness when in a public or exercise area. Failure to comply with the above requirements can result in fines of up to \$1,000 per offence.

It is also the responsibility of the dog owner to insure their dogs are not a nuisance to their neighbours and other residents in the town. This includes excessive barking even when the owners are not at home. Failure to comply with the above requirements can result in fines of up to \$2,000 per offence.
