COMMUNITY CENTRE OVAL REFURBISHMENT

The oval refurbishment is progressing well. All of the pipe has been trenched and laid from the town dam to the oval and the Shire is in the process of installing the reticulation for the oval which will be completed in the first week of October. Following the installation of the reticulation the oval will be levelled in preparation for the finalisation of the refurbishment. The Shire apologises for any inconvenience in the next few months as there will be some interruptions and limited access to the oval during this time.

VINTAGE MACHINERY SHED

As many of you will have noticed by now the shed to house the vintage machinery near the toilet amenities has been erected. The shed is still in the process of being completed and once completed in October, vintage machinery will then be sourced to store in the shed. The Vintage Machinery Shed is a project funded under the 2008/09 Royalties for Regions program.

drumMUSTER

The *drumMUSTER* collection was conducted at the Wandering Refuse Site on Friday 10 September 2010. Thanks to everyone that dropped of their drums with approximately 340 drums returned on the day.

WANDERING FUEL FACILITY

The Shire has applied for additional funding for the fuel facility site through the Country Local Government Fund. Currently a business case for the project, and other projects under the Dryandra Region of Councils, is being prepared by the Wheatbelt Development Commission for assessment by the Department of Regional Development and Lands. The Shire is still hopeful of having the fuel facility operational by early 2011, however the finalisation of the site will hinge on the result of funding since any works funded through the CLGF must not be spent retrospectively.

DOGS

There continue to be numerous reports of dogs roaming the streets in Wandering in recent weeks. Residents in town are reminded that all dogs are required to be registered and must be controlled by means of a chain, cord, leash or harness when in a public or exercise area. Failure to comply with the above requirements will result in fines of up to \$1,000 per offence.

WANDERING REFUSE SITE

It is becoming of increasing concern to Council that the rules associated with the Wandering Refuse Site are continually not being adhered to. The Refuse Site has clearly marked areas for Household Rubbish, Green Waste, Building Material, Scrap Metal and many other drop off points and associated waste and materials must be dumped in these areas at all times. Your cooperation in adhering to these simple rules is imperative to the continuation of the site as continued failure to adhere to these rules will ultimately result in the closure of the Refuse Site under the Environmental Protection Act and offenders will be fined if they do not adhere to these simple rules.
